CALVIN RAMPTON COMPLEX Municipal Project



PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

- ◆ The Calvin L. Rampton Complex is a public safety building housing the Utah Department of Transportation and the Utah Highway Patrol. McNeil Group was commissioned by the State of Utah Division of Facilities Construction & Management to redesign the main front entry plaza and rear patio areas. The concrete is severely damaged in both areas creating not only an eyesore but a safety hazard as well. The landscape and irrigation system for both areas were nearly non-existent and was in need of upgrading. Utilizing the existing grid pattern of both areas created by the existing large honey locust trees, the design team found a solution that retained the integrity of the trees, accentuated primary walking patterns, minimized unnecessary paving, created additional landscape areas to soften the hardscape, and provided seating and picnic areas for the employees to enjoy.
- ◆ McNeil Engineering provided leadership on all issues related to the planning and design efforts including data collection, site analysis, meetings with stakeholders and user groups, conceptual design, cost estimating, and the generation of construction documents. The planning and design services were recently completed the fall of 2011 and the project should be bid and constructed in 2012.
